TRADITIONS

Bill McFarland

I've thought some about why it is that Thanksgiving has turned out to be the favorite of many of us. One reason, I'm convinced, is that there is something calming and humbling about even the thought of gratitude. But I think that, in practice, there is another reason: the traditions most of us have developed in our families as we have enjoyed the occasion down through the years.

There is something about the observance of our American Thanksgiving Day which particularly lends it to such traditions. There is a historical background to it. It is always on the same day of the week. It comes to mean family gatherings and the trips which make them possible, certain kinds of wonderful foods, and relaxing activities which can be repeated. I think it also helps that not as much commercialization and religious debate surrounds it as some of our other holidays.

An important spiritual question may be raised against this background. What is the place of tradition in the lives of God's children? This is a matter which has sometimes been a source of trouble. Some think anything that has become a tradition is the law. Others act as if anything traditional is the enemy. Those in between run the risk of concluding that all things are merely matters of personal preference.

The scriptures make it clear that where tradition either contradicts or takes the place of what the Lord has said, it is wrong. Jesus taught that the tradition of men must not be allowed to cause us to leave the commandment of God or to make the demands of his word void (Mk. 7:8, 13). The apostles emphasized that we are not to allow anyone to take us captive to human tradition as if it were equal to the will of Christ or a necessary supplement to his work (Col. 2:8, 9).

They made it just as certain, however, that things are not wrong merely because they have been said or done before. Paul could write, for example, this: "So then, brothers, stand firm and hold to the traditions that you were taught by us, either by our spoken word or by our letter" (2 Thes. 2:15). There is a difference between inspired truth which has been handed down and human practices which have been developed.

In between are the "how we do things in our family" customs that we all have. They are not law and they are not hindrances to be gotten rid of as soon as possible; they are life. It would be the height of arrogance and immaturity to claim that we can do without them.


Prayer Lists and Announcements

WORDS OF EQUAL IMPORTANCE

In the New Testament there are different words used which have the same meaning. Such is true with the word "gospel" and the word "truth." In 2nd Thes. 1:8 the Apostle Paul used the word "gospel" as something to be obeyed. In 1st Peter 1:22 Peter uses the word "truth" as something to be obeyed and so does Paul in Galatians 3:1. However, in Gal. 1:6 he used the word "gospel" as what they had obeyed in order to make them his "brethren." In the old King James, as well as the New, Paul is asking the Galatian brethren "...who has bewitched you that ye should not obey the truth..?" Why would he ask such a question when they had already "obeyed the gospel/truth?" The Bible clearly shows that the gospel obeyed constitutes a form of the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ when completing one's obedience in baptism. (See 1st Cor. 15:1-4 and Rom. 6:1-6, 17-18). The answer is simple. The "gospel preached" and the "gospel obeyed" must not stop at baptism. Jesus taught this early in his ministry when he used the word gospel to include such things as "*healing the brokenhearted, etc*" (Luke 4:18). Christ demonstrated this thought in his own actions when he "*went about doing good*" which was a part of declaring the gospel (Acts 18:8). Maybe we need to take another look at the question, "have you obeyed the gospel" - meaning in its fullness?
