One of the high privileges we have as fellow-members of a congregation of the Lord's people is the opportunity to share in occasions that bring joy. Our families here have been blessed with several beautiful little ones recently, and we are not unmindful of the wonder and the precious gift each one of them is. We count each one of them as ours, too, and we thank their parents for sharing them with us. May we aim for excellence in the way we love them, teach them, and set examples of faith for them.

The Spirit of Abram

One of the great truths from the Old Testament concerning the desire of God toward his people can be seen in the story of Abram and his nephew, Lot. Even before God changed his name to Abraham, this man demonstrated the attributes of righteousness in his attitude toward others. As the years rolled by, he became known as "the Friend of God" (James 2:23) because of his righteousness. No doubt this title began to form in those early years as Abram spoke to Lot about the difficulties which had developed between their herdsmen. What beautiful words Abram used in Genesis 13:8: "*And Abram said unto Lot, Let there be no strife, I pray thee, between me and thee, and between my herdsmen and thy herdsmen; for we be brethren.*" These last four words are those which really exemplify the Spirit of Abram and should have set the pattern for all of us. Being concerned about others, especially those of our own spiritual family, should still be our desire. Another great principle was also set in this same story. Remember, Abram gave his nephew first choice in the direction they were to take. God blessed Abram and his life has become an example for thousands of years. The story of Lot was not so good! What can be said - what will be said - what does God think - when strife continues between brethren? Let us today consider the Spirit of Abram.
