You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. (Matt. 5:14)

"BY THIS WE KNOW LOVE"

The power of love in human experience is such that a healthy grasp of what it means to love is crucial. Because we are capable of making all things about what we want and how we feel at the moment, destructive things may be done and said under a mislabeled banner of love. That is why the phrase which appears as our title is so important.

It comes from First John 3:16. Each part of the phrase is meaningful. "We" reminds us as Christians that we will see this differently from the way the world does. "Know" suggests that real love, though it may surpass all our descriptions, can be identified, understood, and experienced. "By this" declares that the conduct of our Lord is the last word on what true love is and how it behaves.

We know love by the fact "that he laid down his life for us." In so doing, he forever settled the question of whether real love is about what the one who loves gets out of it for himself. The love modeled by Christ seeks the good of the one loved and gives of self to accomplish that good. It is sacrificial.

We also know something about love from realizing that he did this "for us." That is, he sought our good at a time when we did not love him (cf. 1 Jn. 4:10). Love does something other than respond on an in-kind basis to what another person has already done. Our Lord offered himself for us when we had nothing to offer.

We know love by the fact that Jesus did such a thing because it was his Father's will. It was in his being sent that the love of God was made manifest (1 Jn. 4:9). Love is defined by his willingness to obey his Father even to the point of laying down his life for undeserving people. Love is still willing action in obedience to God's commandments because of devotion to him (cf. 1 Jn. 5:2,3; 2 Jn. 6).

We know love by doing what we ought to do. The verse from which we have taken our title concludes, "And we ought to lay down our lives for the brothers." What is appropriate in our treatment of other people is determined by how our actions look in view of what Christ has done.

John concludes, "Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed in truth" (1 Jn. 3:18). As Christians, we must know love by actually treating those who are around us every day lovingly.
