You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. (Matt. 5:14)

"BUT LET US KEEP AWAKE"

(Read on: I'm not talking about the sermon!)

Have you seen the news reports about the two flights that had to land unattended at Reagan National in Washington? It happened one night recently when the pilots could get no response from the tower at the airport. The recorded conversation between the two of them reflects their puzzlement over the situation. One suggested that the controller may have gotten locked out of the tower. The other commented that he had never heard of such a thing. It turns out that the potentially disastrous silence from the air traffic control tower was the result of the simplest and most basic problem of them all: the person on duty was asleep!

Again and again the scriptures urge us to bear in mind that we are engaged in a spiritual endeavor in which there is much at stake. Our full attention is required. It is absolutely necessary that we wake up and keep alert.

The prophets used this image to point to hope in the Lord and to call their people to renewed life with him. Their senses had been dulled and their hearts had been driven to despair by having made themselves at home in the darkness of unrighteousness, but the light of the Lord was rising to shine on them, and it was time to wake up and put on the beautiful garments of strength and righteousness (Isa. 51:17; 60:1; 52:1; Mal. 4:2).

With the ministry of Jesus, the sunrise visited us from on high to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death (Lk. 1:78, 79). "In him was life, and the life was the light of men" (Jn. 1:4). Sleepers can awake and arise from the dead and he will shine on them (Eph. 5:14). But, according to him, the blessed are those whom the master finds awake, dressed for action, having kept their lamps burning, waiting for him (Lk. 12:35-37). Where he is master, servants are alert.

We do not know when to expect him, but we do know that the hour has come for us to wake from sleep. We know that salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed. We know that the day is at hand, and that the works of darkness have to be cast off, and that the armor of light must be put on (Rom. 13:11, 12).

Our identity is at stake. In Christ, we are children of light, children of the day. Unfruitful and shameful works of darkness have to give way to faith and hope and love. "We are not of the night or of the darkness. So then let us not sleep as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober" (1 Thes. 5:5, 6).

PLEASED - WELL PLEASED - NOT PLEASED - DISPLEASED

It is interesting to see just how many times and different ways the Bible uses the word "**please.**" The title of this article gives you some idea of how this is true. The question is not so important as to how many times the writers of the Bible used this word in its different forms, but whether we care if God is **pleased** with us or not? For example: God was **not pleased** with his people for their openness in carnal matters and what they called "play" as they made their way through their wilderness wanderings. In like matter He was **not pleased** with what they called "worship" as was the case of the Golden Calf (Exod. 32; 1st Cor. 10). Continuing with this thought, God also is **pleased** with a strong and sincere "faith" as Hebrews 11:6 advises. He wants us to offer the fruit of our lips - the giving of thanks - doing good and communicating well with each other and declares these are things that are "**well pleasing**" with Him (Heb. 13:15-16). What people think of us or how we think of others may also be **either pleased, well pleased, not pleased or displeased** with God. He is certainly "**displeased**" when we rejoice over some misfortune which has happened to those we dislike (Prov. 24:17:18). Since the way is narrow which leads to life eternal (Matt. 7:13-14), I would highly suggest that we give more consideration to **what pleases God** especially in the lifestyles we choose.
