IS THE DOOR TOO LITTLE OR THE BEAM TOO WIDE?

Most of us are familiar with these words “judge not, that ye be not judged” (Matt. 7:1). The fact is that we so often quote this verse without looking at verse 3: “And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother’s eye, but considerest not the beam that is in thine own eye?” Albert Barnes in his commentary on this verse states, “we are more apt to see the little sins in others than we are the big sins in our own lives.” Actually this verse is rather humorous. Can you visualize a person who makes a judgment over the tiny speck in his brother’s eye but cannot see a large squared piece of timber in his own eye? Christians should know that there is one righteous judge and that he will judge the world in righteousness (Acts 17:31). They also should know “that judgment must begin at the house of God” (1st Peter 4:17). If it must begin with those in the household of God - meaning “the church of the living God” (1st Tim. 3:15) before making any judgment at all, we must be in the house of God. There seems to be a problem here. If we are still walking around with the big piece of squared timber in our eye, how will we get through the “door” - meaning Christ who is that door (John 10:7)? It is obvious that we are trying to get through the wrong door or that our beam is too wide. The real answers lie in the forgiving spirit of man coupled with the grace and mercy of God knowing that we have submitted ourselves to “the righteousness of God”(Rom. 10:3).
