A Teacher Worth Imitating

Few passages reinforce my confidence in Christ more than the part of the Gospel of Luke we have been reading (chapters 6 through 8). If “everyone when he is fully trained will be like his teacher” (6:40), he is the one who deserves to be followed until we have learned from him how to live.

Consider how this conviction unfolds. First, Jesus declares a complete reversal of commonly assumed values: he turns upon its head the world’s thinking about what enriches, what satisfies, what leads to joy, and what brings a reward. Then, he demands behavior toward others that is like the God who is kind even to the ungrateful and the evil—not just the usual blessing of those who are a blessing—because goodness comes from the heart of a person, not as a response to someone else. Finally, he describes those who hear him and do what he says as building upon a foundation that will serve them well when the floods of life arise.

Assertions like these should neither be made out of thin air nor accepted without reason, and they are not. Remember what happens as the account continues. The Lord heals a respected centurion’s servant from a distance as well as an overlooked woman who touches him. He gives back a dead son to his widowed mother and raises up the only young daughter of a ruler of the synagogue. He calms a raging storm for his frightened friends and casts out a legion of demons from a forsaken victim. He accepts the loving service of a woman he has forgiven much, and he reassures a great man in his questioning.

This is “the Teacher” (8:49). The way he says I should go about life may be surprising, and is certain to be difficult (it did, after all, lead him to a cross). But if what he says about life is held fast in a good and honest heart, it will bear precious fruit in all circumstances. What’s more, it will show one to be a member of the family of “those who hear the word of God and do it.”
